

Approved Remediation Processes

"Remediation" means the process of reducing or eliminating contaminants from cannabis or cannabis products using physical, chemical, or biological means.

Any remediation processes intended to be used on cannabis or cannabis products must be submitted to the Cannabis Office for review before being performed on cannabis material. Pursuant to 560-RICR-10-10-2.26(I)(1), the Commission (or designee) shall review and determine in its sole discretion whether the request to remediate will be approved. The Commission, in its sole discretion, may approve specific remediation processes allowable for licensees to conduct without prior Commission approval.

The following remediation practices have been approved by the Commission and are considered allowable for licensees to conduct without prior approval from the Commission. Post remediation, cannabis <u>must</u> be submitted for all required testing in accordance with 216-RICR-60-05-6.

Allowable Remediation Processes for Microbiological Contamination

- Ozone
- X-Ray
- Hydrogen Peroxide

Allowable Remediation Processes for Residual Solvents

- Exportation
- Vacuum Purging

All remediated cannabis <u>must</u> be marked as such within Metric and may be labeled as such for consumers. If a remediation practice is not listed in this document, a request must be submitted to ccc.cannabisCompliance@ccc.ri.gov prior to execution of an unapproved remediation technique. The Cannabis Office may request additional documentation including but not limited to certificates of analysis, testing results, and standard operating procedures.
