Changes to Future Packaging Requirements

- Transfer authority to Cannabis Control Commission from Department of Business Regulation
- Require tamper-evident packaging
- Allow all colors excluding fluorescent and neon
 - Removed requirement of neutral colors
- All cannabis product (medical and AU) shall adhere to these requirements



Packaging: Ongoing Regulatory Requirements

Certified child resistant packaging and resealable when applicable
Small container guidance will remain in external guidance document

Cannabis Licensee Compliance

• Within 90 days from the effective date of the rules and regulation promulgation

 All cannabis product (medical and adult use) shall adhere to these requirements

Applies to all cannabis establishment licensees

Packaging: Policy considerations for changes

- Allowing color provides for more branding freedom for licensees
 - Aligned with Cannabis Advisory Board recommendation
- Brings Rhode Island in line with other states adult-use requirements (MA, VT, ME, NY, CT*)
- Brands can be more competitive with neighboring states

*CT: Allows single-color, opaque packaging with a black and white label + one logo up to 3 colors. Edible packaging, including logo, can only be black and white.

Changes to Future Labeling Requirements

- Transfer authority to Cannabis Control Commission from Department of Business Regulation
- Removes requirement of Cannabis Office pre-approval of logos and/or graphics
- Allows all colored text, excluding neon, as long as it is legible and clearly visible
- Allows the use of data matrix (e.g., QR code), with prior Commission approval
- Allow but not require the labeling of remediation and method used



Changes to Future Labeling Requirements continued

- Addition of specific warning: "Use of cannabis may impair your ability to operate a vehicle or machinery"
- Removes requirement of generalized rotating warnings
- Require name of testing facility that conducted product testing and its pass date
- Require identifying Cannabinoid profile and removes labeling just THC/CBD content
- Protecting children remains top priority by maintaining requirements like the 1"x1" sized THC symbol, resealable certified child resistant packaging, and prohibitions on attractive child-like cartoons.



Labeling: Continued Regulatory Requirements

- Requirement that logo and/or graphic not be larger than the THC universal symbol
 - Ex: 1"x1" THC symbol = 1"x1" Graphic and/or Logo
 - Deviation from CAB recommendation, which recommended allowing for logo and/or graphic sizes to increase once THC symbol reached 1"x1"
- Required warnings must be placed in bright yellow box
- Prohibition on shape of cannabis products (animals, cartoons, fruit) and any other labeling that clearly appeals to children
- Prohibition on imitating or resemblance to any existing branded consumer products (foods, snacks, candies)
